Message from FR. MICHAEL L. PASTRIKOS, PROTOPRESBYTER

As we move towards Pascha with rapid steps and we get ready to embark in the great spirituality of Holy week, we can never forget that our Orthodox Church is the Church of the Resurrection because it gives prominence to Christ's victory over death. Now is the time to stop for a minute and reflect on the transforming power that Great Lent produces for all Christians. The beautiful recipe that is given to us through the Lenten period, a time to fast, to pray, to meditate,

and to give Alms to the less fortunate of the world. it also gives another true example of how we Christians should joyfully share more of our time, talent, and treasure with our Church through Stewardship for the greater purpose of salvation, not just as individuals, but as a Community of brothers and sisters in Christ. Let's not forget, as the Fathers of the Church describe it, the Church is a hospital for all of us, since we inherited a fallen nature, we are suffering from various diseases that keep us from being who God wants us to become. The Church provides the place, the means and the doctor to help us heal our wounds-

our weaknesses, and our short comings of our falseness. The purpose of the Church, when it instituted the fasting, prayer, and almsgiving was to give us the tools to achieve the likeness of God-who by the way- is the only doctor of our souls and bodies. This is one of the greatest opportunities given to us during this Lenten season-on top of prayer and fasting in preparation for the Resurrection we are called to serve God and volunteering our time and energy anyway we can knowing that through this process we can make a difference in the lives of others who are going through rough times in their lives. It should never be forgotten that our Lord Jesus Christ came to us in order to die, this was known by Him, at least from the very beginning. In life we meet many difficulties and discouragements. We should not take this wonderful celebration of Christ's Resurrection from the dead so lightly. we have come through Meatfare, Cheesefare, and the Great Lenten period, and now we have experienced the Passions of Christ through Holy Week services, leading to the great climax the Crucifixion and Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. After that process, we must be truly elated by the fact Pascha, the Passover of Christ, will touch

our souls and will offer us the illumination of joy filled with God's grace.

In the Holy Icon of the Resurrection it symbolizes His radical descent into Hades to save all who have died. The golden bars by His feet are the gates of Hades. The keys floating in the Abyss below symbolizes that he has entered and conquered both death and Hades. You may also note the skeletal

figure who is chained up: that is Death! he has been bound and killed by Christ. Let's remember the Resurrection Hymn that we chant during the Resurrection service-"Christ has trampled down death by death". Looking in the Icon we also see Christ-holding hands with Adam and Eve-He is pulling them up from the Abyss symbolizing that His victory redeems all mankind - even back to the beginning of creation. To His left we see three Old Testament Saints Kings David and Solomon, two of His ancestors according to his fleshly nature. We also see John the Baptist who was his forerunner in both life and death. On the right side we have

the New testament, including the Apostles who are alive. The purpose is to show that Christ's redemption transcends time and space. The blue shaped oval that surrounds Christ is called the Mandorla, it is the uncreated eternal light of Christ. This is not just simply a pretty bright light- it is the same light which filled the Apostles when they witnessed His Transfiguration on the Mountain of Tabor.

To conclude, we are now in the heart of our spiritual journey. We will once again witness Christ's Passions, His Crucifixion, His Resurrection, and finally His Ascension. We all know that Pascha celebrates the promise of life in the face of death. With that in mind, I pray that the glorious un-waning light of the Resurrection of Christ shine in the deepest corners of our souls transforming us also into the light and bringing us all in Communion with Christ, the true Son of Righteousness.

I leave you with these wonderful and spiritual words: CHRIST IS RISEN!! TRULY HE IS RISEN!!!

Μήνυμα Από τον Πατέρα Μιχαήλ Λ. Παστρικό

Καθώς προχωρούμε προς το Πάσχα με γοργά βήματα και ετοιμαζόμαστε να ξεκινήσουμε τη μεγάλη πνευματικότητα της Μεγάλης Εβδομάδας, δεν πρέπει ποτέ να ξεχνάμε ότι η Ορθόδοξη Εκκλησία μας είναι η Εκκλησία της Αναστάσεως, διότι δίνει έμφαση στη νίκη του Χριστού κατά του θανάτου. Τώρα είναι η στιγμή να σταματήσουμε για ένα λεπτό και να αναρωτηθούμε σχετικά με τη δύναμη μετασχηματισμού που ασκεί η Μεγάλη Τεσσαρακοστή σε όλους τους Χριστιανούς. Η υπέροχη συνταγή που μας δίνεται μέσω της περιόδου της Σαρακοστής, είναι: εποχή νηστείας, προσευχής και διαλογισμού, και βοήθειας στους λιγότερο τυχερούς του κόσμου. Μας δίνει επίσης ένα άλλο αξιόλογο παράδειγμα για το πως οι Χριστιανοί πρέπει με χαρά να μοιράζονται το χρόνο τους, το ταλέντο, και το οικονομικό τους με την Εκκλησία τους, μέσω της Εθελοντικής Προσφοράς με απώτερο σκοπό τη σωτηρία τους, όχι μόνο ως άτομα, αλλά και ως Κοινότητα αποτελουμένη από αδελφούς και αδελφές εν Χριστώ. Ας μην ξεχνάμε, όπως το περιέγραψαν οι Άγιοι Πατέρες της Εκκλησίας μας, ότι η Εκκλησία είναι το νοσοκομείο για όλους μας, από τότε που κληρονομήσαμε μια πεσμένη φύση, και πάσχουμε από διάφορες ασθένειες που μας παρεμποδίζουν να είμαστε όπως θέλει ο Θεός να είμαστε. Η Εκκλησία παρέχει τον χώρο, τα μέσα και τον γιατρό για να μας βοηθήσει να θεραπεύσουμε τις πληγές μας - τις αδυναμίες μας και τις ελλείψεις των ψευδαισθήσεών μας. Σκοπός της Εκκλησίας, όταν καθιέρωσε τη νηστεία, την προσευχή και την ελεημοσύνη, ήταν να μας δώσει τα απαραίτητα μέσα για να επιτύχουμε την κατ' εικόνα και ομοίωση με το Θεό - ο οποίος όπως γνωρίζουμε - είναι ο μόνος γιατρός των ψυχών και των σωμάτων μας. Είναι μια από τις σημαντικότερες ευκαιρίες που μας δίνεται κατά τη διάρκεια τη Σαρακοστής- που εκτός από την προσευχή και τη νηστεία για την προετοιμασία της Ανάστασης, καλούμαστε να υπηρετούμε τον Θεό και να προσφέρουμε εθελοντικά τον χρόνο και την ενέργειά μας, που ούτως ή άλλως γνωρίζουμε, ότι μέσω αυτής της διαδικασίας μπορούμε να καλλιτερεύσουμε τις ζωές άλλων ανθρώπων που περνούν δύσκολες στιγμές στη ζωή τους. Δεν θάπρεπε ποτέ να ξεχνούμε ότι ο Κύριος μας Ιησούς Χριστός ήρθε σ εμάς για να πεθάνει, το γνώριζε από την αρχή. Στη ζωή συναντάμε πολλές δυσκολίες και απογοητεύσεις. Δεν πρέπει να παίρνουμε αυτή την υπέροχη και χαρμόσυνη εορτή της Ανάστασης του Χριστού εκ νεκρών, έτσι ελαφρά τη καρδία. Περάσαμε μέσω της περιόδου της Απόκρεω, της Τυρινής και της Μεγάλης Τεσσαρακιστής και τώρα θα βιώσουμε τα Πάθη του Χριστού μέσα από τις Ακολουθίες της Μεγάλης Εβδομάδας, που θα μας οδηγήσουν στο αποκορύφωμα της Σταύρωσης και της Ανάστασης του Κυρίου και Σωτήρα μας Ιησού Χριστού. Μετά από αυτή τη διαδικασία, θα πρέπει συνεπαρμένοι πραγματικά από το Πάσχα, το Πάσχα του

Χριστού να αγγίξει τις ψυχές μας και να μας προσφέρει το φωτισμό, και την ανάταση της χαράς, που είναι πλήρης με τη χάρη του Θεού.

Η Ιερά Εικόνα της Ανάστασης συμβολίζει τη κάθοδο Του στον Άδη για να σώσει όλους όσοι απεβίωσαν. Οι χρυσές ράβδοι στα πόδια Του συμβολίζουν τις πύλες του Άδη. Τα κλειδιά που επιπλέουν στην ΄Αβυσσο παρακάτω, συμβολίζουν ότι έχει έλθει και κατέκτησε τόσο το θάνατο όσο και τον Άδη. Μπορείτε επίσης να παρατηρήσετε την σκελετική μορφή που είναι αλυσοδεμένη. Αυτός είναι ο θάνατος! Που έχει δεσμευτεί και σκοτωθεί από τον Χριστό.

Ας θυμηθούμε τον Ύμνο της Ανάστασης που ψάλλουμε κατά τη διάρκεια της Ακολουθίας της Αναστάσεως - «Θανάτω θάνατον πατήσας... πάτησε τον θάνατο με το θάνατο». Εξετάζοντας την εικόνα βλέπουμε επίσης τον Χριστό, να κρατά χέρια με τον Αδάμ και την Εύα- ο Χριστός τους τραβά επάνω από την άβυσσο που συμβολίζει τη νίκη Του που λυτρώνει όλη την ανθρωπότητα - ακόμα και από την αρχή της δημιουργίας. Στα αριστερά Του βλέπουμε τρεις Αγίους Βασιλείς της Παλαιάς Διαθήκης, των Αγίων Βασιλέων Δαβίδ και Σολομώντα, δύο από τους προγόνους του, σύμφωνα με σαρκική φύση Του. Βλέπουμε επίσης τον Ιωάννη τον Βαπτιστή ο οποίος ήταν ο πρόδρομος Του, τόσο στη ζωή όσο και στον θάνατο. Στη δεξιά πλευρά έχουμε την Καινή Διαθήκη, που συμπεριλαμβάνει τους Αποστόλους, οι οποίοι είναι ζωντανοί. Ο σκοπός είναι να δείξει ότι η λύτρωση του Χριστού υπερβαίνει το χρόνο και το χώρο. Το θαλασσί οβάλ σχήμα που περιβάλλει το Χριστό ονομάζεται Μάντορλα, είναι το άκτιστο αιώνιο φως του Χριστού. Δεν είναι απλώς μια πολύ φωτεινή λάμψη - είναι το ίδιο φως που πλήρωσε τους Αποστόλους όταν είδαν την Μεταμόρφωση Του στο Βουνό Θαβώρ.

Τελειώνοντας, βρισκόμαστε πλέον στην καρδιά του πνευματικού ταξιδιού μας. Για άλλη μια φορά θα γίνουμε μάρτυρες των Παθών του Χριστού, της Σταύρωσής Του, της Ανάστασής Του, και, τέλος, της Ανάληψής Του. Όλοι γνωρίζουμε ότι το Πάσχα γιορτάζει την υπόσχεση ζωής μπροστά στο θάνατο. Με αυτό κατά νου, προσεύχομαι ότι το ένδοξο αμείωτο φως της Αναστάσεως του Χριστού, λάμψει στις βαθύτερες γωνιές της ψυχής μας, μεταμορφώνοντάς μας επίσης με το φως και να φέρει όλους μας σε κοινωνία με τον Χριστό, τον αληθινό Υιό της Δικαιοσύνης.

Feast of the Annunciation 2018

The Very Reverend and Reverend Clergy

Honorable Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, Esteemed Members of the Metropolitan Council, Esteemed Members of the Parish Councils, Philoptochos Sisterhood, Faculty and Students of the Catechetical and Greek Afternoon Schools, Directors and Participants of all Youth Organizations, and all devout Orthodox Christians of the Greek Orthodox Communities of our Holy Metropolis of New Jersey

"The fetters of the curse once laid on our forefather now are loosed. And so with all the world we cry out to you, 'Rejoice, O Maiden full of grace'"

My Beloved in the Lord,

Today we are granted the continual gift of salvation as we experience the unsurpassing love of God for His creation as His eternal Divine Plan for humanity finds its initial revelation in the person of the Virgin Mary who answers an unequivocal "Yes" to God when she said to the Archangel Gabriel, "Behold the handmaiden of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). With these words, this young woman full of devote faith became the Theotokos, the one who bears God.

As with all blessings, the blessings of her eternal reward would not come without struggle. She would find herself making a journey with her betrothed, Joseph, while she was still yet pregnant. She would have to give birth to Christ in a cave due to there not being any place for her elsewhere. Her Son would be hunted by a maniacal king thus driving her family into exile. She would experience the joy of seeing her Son "increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men" (Luke 2:52). She would see her Son begin His ministry and eventually enter the city of Jerusalem with throngs of people exclaiming "Hosanna!" She would witness her Son and her Lord be delivered to Pontius Pilate before being crucified in a horrific manner and dying before her very eyes. The extraordinary blessing of bearing the Savior would mean that she would have an equally extraordinary struggle. In the end, however, she would also see her Son resurrected and ascend to heaven in glory.

Likewise, though God grants us bountiful blessings every day, we must also be prepared to struggle. This struggle helps to fortify our Orthodox Christian character and prepares us to worthily receive Christ Himself. The free-will choice of the Theotokos initiated the Divine Plan which would see humanity released from the bonds of slavery to death and have the

opportunity to enter into the Lord's Kingdom. Therefore, by exercising our free will and choosing to have a personal relationship with God, we follow the example of the Theotokos and, thus, move further away from the "sickness unto death" and closer to eternal life.

Finally, today also marks the 197th anniversary of Greek Independence Day. We celebrate the Greek people rising up against the Ottoman powers and declaring that we no longer would be subject to their tyrannical reign, cruel oppression, and religious persecution. The struggle of our forefathers to gain freedom was successful, however, it would be almost another century of struggle before the rest of Greece would become free and even to this day we still struggle for religious freedom for our Mother Church, the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople. And in their enduring sacrifice, what began at the monastery of Agia Lavra as an alliance of clergy and laity, of fathers and sons, of mothers and daughters, of tradesmen and paupers, of farmers and sailors, of statesmen and students, of Greeks and Philhellenes, lives today two centuries later as the nation of Greece.

It is my fervent prayer that as we celebrate the Feast of the Annunciation, that we endeavor to learn the true meaning of Christian struggle as a means to overcome evil and come closer to God thus mirroring the example of the Theotokos. Furthermore, on this Greek Independence Day, it is my sincerest hope that we remember the struggle of our forefathers and the struggle of all persecuted people throughout the world as they pursue freedom and liberty.

Ή 25η Μαρτίου ἀποτελεῖ γιά κάθε ἑλληνική ὀρθόδοξη ψυχή ἡμέρα θρησκευτικῆς εὐφροσύνης ἀλλά καί ἱστορικῆς μνήμης, ἡμέρα διπλῆς ἑορτῆς, τῆς προσωπικῆς καί συνάμα τῆς ἐθνικῆς μας παλιγγενεσίας. Ὁ ἑλληνικός λαός, μέ ἀπαράμιλλη σοφία, συνδύασε τήν ἀπαρχή τοῦ ἐθνικοαπελευθερωτικοῦ του ἀγώνα μέ τήν ἑορτή τοῦ Εὐαγγελισμοῦ τῆς Θεοτόκου, ταυτίζοντας ἔτσι τήν ἀπαρχή τῆς σωτηρίας τοῦ γένους τῶν Ἑλλήνων μέ τήν ἀπαρχή τῆς σωτηρίας τοῦ ἀνθρωπίνου γένους. Κοινό στοιχεῖο τῶν δύο αὐτῶν γεγονότων εἶναι ἡ ἀνυπολόγιστη καί εὐλογημένη ἀξία τῆς ἐλευθερίας καί, ὅπως πολύ σωστά ἀποτυπώνει ὁ ποιητής, εἶναι

«δύο λευτεριές πού σμίγουνε μέσα στήν ἴδια μέρα... ή λευτεριά τοῦ Ἑλληνα καί ή λευτεριά τοῦ ἀνθρώπου».

Στόν Εὐαγγελισμό, ή ἔννοια τῆς ἐλευθερίας σαρκώνεται μέ τή συγκατάθεση τῆς Παναγίας στό χαρμόσυνο μήνυμα τοῦ Ἀρχαγγέλου Γαβριήλ γιά τόν ἐρχομό τοῦ Βασιλιᾶ τῆς Ζωῆς καί τῆς Ανάστασης, τοῦ Θεοῦ καί Λόγου. Τό «γένοιτό μοι κατά τό ῥῆμα σου», πού λέει ταπεινά ἡ ἀειπάρθενος Μαρία, γίνεται Εὐαγγελισμός τῆς σωτηρίας ὅλου τοῦ ἀνθρωπίνου γένους, τῆς νίκης κατά τοῦ θανάτου καί τῆς δυνατότητας ἐπιστροφῆς του στόν χαμένο παράδεισο. Κλείνει ὁριστικά τό κεφάλαιο τῆς φθορᾶς καί τῆς ὑποδούλωσης στήν ἁμαρτία καί ἀνοίγει τό κεφάλαιο τῆς λύτρωσης καί τῆς ἐλευθερίας.

Όχι τυχαία, λοιπόν, ό Εὐαγγελισμός γίνεται αἰῶνες μετά μήνυμα ἀνάστασης τοῦ ὑπόδουλου ἑλληνικοῦ γένους, γεμίζοντας τίς ψυχές τῶν Ἑλλήνων μέ τήν ἐλπίδα ὅτι ἡ Παναγία ὡς «Υπέρμαχος Στρατηγός», θά τούς βοηθήσει στόν δίκαιο Ἁγῶνα τους. Όπως χαρακτηριστικά διαλαλοῦσε ὁ Κολοκοτρώνης, ὁ Θεός ὑπόγραψε γιά τήν ἐλευθερία τῆς Ἑλλάδος καί δέν παίρνει πίσω τήν ὑπογραφή Του. Ὁ Εὐαγγελισμός τοῦ ἔτους 1821, λοιπόν, ἀποτελεῖ ἀναμφίβολα τήν ἀπαρχή τοῦ ἀγώνα τῶν Ἑλλήνων γιά τή λευτεριά, καθώς παίρνει σάρκα καί ὀστᾶ ἡ ἀπόφασή τους νά ἀποτινάξουν τήν τυραννία τῆς μακρόχρονης σκλαβιᾶς καί νά διεκδικήσουν τήν αὐτοδιάθεσή τους.

Στούς τέσσερις σκοτεινούς αἰῶνες τῆς δουλείας τοῦ ἑλληνικοῦ ἔθνους πού προηγήθηκαν, ἡ Ὀρθόδοξη Ἐκκλησία, ὡς θεσμός καί ὡς χῶρος, στάθηκε ἀληθινή κιβωτός του, διασώζοντας τή γλῶσσα, τήν ἐθνική καί θρησκευτική συνείδηση καί τίς παραδόσεις τοῦ ἑλληνικοῦ λαοῦ, ἑνώνοντας τόν ὑπόδουλο λαό σέ σύνολο, διατηρώντας τήν ἐπαφή του με τό μακρινό ἔνδοξο παρελθόν του καί τρέφοντας τον με τήν ἐλπίδα τῆς λευτεριᾶς. Ἀλλά καί τά ἐθνικοαπελευθερωτικά κηρύγματα τῶν Ἑλλήνων Διαφωτιστῶν, τοῦ Ρήγα Φεραίου, τοῦ Ἀδαμάντιου Κοραῆ καί τοῦ Πατρο-Κοσμᾶ τοῦ Αἰτωλοῦ ἔγιναν οἱ σπίθες πού φώτισαν τίς μαυρισμένες ψυχές τῶν ὑπόδουλων Ἑλλήνων.

Ποωταγωνιστής αὐτοῦ τοῦ ἔνδοξου ἀγώνα ἕνας ὁλόκληφος λαός, πού σηκώνει τό κεφάλι ἀπέναντι στόν αίμοβόφο κατακτητή του μέ μοναδικό στήφιγμα τήν πίστη στόν Θεό. Ένα όλόκληφο ἔθνος, μέ τήν κφαυγή καί τήν ἀπαίτηση «ΕΛΕΥΘΕΡΙΑ ή ΘΑΝΑΤΟΣ» νά ὑψώνεται σάν λάβαφο σέ στεφιά καί θάλασσα, ξεκινᾶ τόν δύσκολο ἀγώνα του, ὑπό τήν ἡγεσία ἀνθφώπων σεβαστῶν, κληφικῶν καί λαϊκῶν, μέ φλογεφή καφδιά καί πύφινο λόγο. Πολλοί εἶναι αὐτοί πού κατοφθώνουν νά ἐνσαφκώσουν τά ἰδανικά στόν πιό ὑψηλό βαθμό καί νά ἀναδειχθοῦν σέ σύμβολα ἀπαφάμιλλου θάφφους: ὁ Κολοκοτφώνης, ὁ Μακφυγιάννης, ὁ Καφαϊσκάκης, ὁ Νικηταφᾶς, ὁ Παπαφλέσσας, ὁ Διάκος στήν Ἀλαμάνα καί ὁ Ἀνδφοῦτσος στό Χάνι τῆς Γφαβιᾶς, ὁ Καφαϊσκάκης στήν Ἀφάχοβα, ὁ Ψαφιανός πυφπολητής Κανάφης, ὁ Μιαούλης, ἡ Μπουμπουλίνα, ἡ Μαντώ Μαυφογένους καί τόσοι ἄλλοι γνωστοί καί ἄγνωστοι ἀγωνιστές.

Πολλές φορές, ώστόσο, ἀπό τότε καί μέχρι σήμερα ή Ἑλλάδα βρέθηκε στό στόχαστρο ἄλλων λαῶν -κυρίως γειτονικῶν- πού ἐποφθαλμιοῦν μέ προκλητικό καί ἀνεπίτρεπτο τρόπο ὅχι μόνον ἐδάφη, ἄλλα καί τήν ἴδια της τήν ἱστορία. Τό τελευταῖο διάστημα, μάλιστα, ἀναδύθηκε στήν ἐπικαιρότητα γιά μία ἀκόμη φορά τό λεγόμενο «Μακεδονικό ζήτημα». Μέ τήν πλαστογράφηση τῆς ἱστορίας, ἐπιδιώκεται ἡ δημιουργία ἑνός κρατιδίου, τό ὁποῖο σφετερίζεται μέ θρασύτατο τρόπο τό ὄνομα καί τήν ἑλληνική ἱστορία, προκειμένου νά ἐπιβιώσει. Γιά ὅσους, ἔστω καί στοιχειωδῶς, γνωρίζουν τά γεγονότα, εἶναι ξεκάθαρο ὅτι ἡ ἱστορία τῆς Μακεδονίας εἶναι ἀναπόσπαστο κομμάτι τῆς ἑλληνικῆς ἱστορίας.

Οἱ ἀπανταχοῦ Ἅλληνες, ὡς συνεχιστές τῶν ἡρώων τοῦ '21, βροντοφωνάζουν καὶ ἀπαιτοῦν: «Καμία παραχώρηση τοῦ ὀνόματος τῆς Μακεδονίας» καὶ ὅτι «Ἡ Μακεδονία ἦταν, εἶναι καί θά εἶναι πάντα ἑλληνική». Εἶναι ἀπαίτηση τῶν ψυχῶν τῶν Μακεδονομάχων, που ἔδωσαν τή ζωή τούς καὶ ἔχυσαν τό αἷμα τους γιά μία Μακεδονία ἐλεύθερη καὶ ἑλληνική. Ἀποτελεῖ ἐθνικό χρέος, λοιπόν, ὅλων τῶν Ἑλλήνων, ἡ διαφύλαξη τῆς ἱστορικῆς μας μνήμης.

Οἱ Ἑλληνες ἀγαπᾶμε βεβαίως ὅλους τούς λαούς, καί εἰδικά τούς γειτονικούς, καί τό ἔχουμε ἀποδείξει πολλές φοφές. Τό ἑλληνικό Ἐθνος πιστεύει σταθεφά στό δίκαιο. Δέν ἐποφθαλμιᾶ κανενός τό δίκαιο, ἀλλά καί δέν ἀνέχεται ἄλλοι νά καταπατοῦν τό δικό του. Πφοσευχόμαστε γιά τήν ἐπίτευξη συμφωνίας στό ζήτημα τῆς ὀνομασίας καί στηφίζουμε ὅλες τίς εἰφηνικές καί ἀνιδιοτελεῖς δφάσεις πού πφαγματοποιοῦνται ὑπέφ τοῦ δικαίου τῆς πατφίδας καί τοῦ λαοῦ μας. Οἱ Ἑλληνες σέ ὅλα τά μήκη καί πλάτη τοῦ κόσμου, καί ἰδιαίτεφα οἱ Ἑλληνες τῆς Ἀμεφικῆς, ὑπῆφξαν πάντοτε συμπαφαστάτες καί ἀφωγοί σέ κάθε δίκαιη καί εἰλικφινῆ πφοσπάθεια τῆς μητέφας πατφίδας. Αὐτό πφάττουν καί τώφα.

Άγαπητοί μου ἀδελφοί,

Ή σημερινή ήμέρα εἶναι ήμέρα τιμῆς καί εὐγνωμοσύνης πρωτίστως στήν Παναγία μας, πού πάντοτε ὑπῆρξε βοηθός καί συμπαραστάτης τοῦ Ἐθνους μας, καί ἔπειτα τῶν ἠρώων πού θυσιάστηκαν γιά τή δική μας ἐλευθερία. HOLY FRIDAY - April 6

When Friday dawned, Christ was sent bound from Caiaphas to Pontius Pilate, who was then Governor of Judea. Pilate interrogated Him in many ways, and once and again acknowledged that He was innocent, but to please the Jews, he later passed the sentence of death against Him. After scourging the Lord of all as though He were a runaway slave, he surrendered Him to be crucified.

Thus the Lord Jesus was handed over to the soldiers, was stripped of His garments, was clothed in a purple robe, was crowned with a wreath of thorns, had a reed placed in His hand as though it were a sceptre, was bowed before in mockery, was spat upon, and was buffeted in the face and on the head. Then they again clothed Him in His own garments, and bearing the cross, He came to Golgotha, a place of condemnation, and there, about the third hour, He was crucified between two thieves. Although both blasphemed Him at the first, the thief at His right hand repented, and said: "Remember me, O Lord, when Thou

comest in Thy Kingdom," to which our Saviour answered, "Today shalt thou be with Me in Paradise." As He hung upon the Cross, He was blasphemed by those who were passing by, was mocked by the high priests, and by the soldiers was given vinegar to drink mixed with gall. About the ninth hour, He cried out with a loud voice, saying, "It is finished." And the Lamb of God "Which taketh away the sin of the world" (John 1:29) expired on the day when the moon was full, and at the hour when, according to the Law, was slain the Passover lamb, which was established as a type of Him in the time of Moses.

Even lifeless creation mourned the death of the Master, and it trembled and was altered out of fear. Yet, even though the Maker of creation was already dead, they pierced Him in His immaculate side, and forthwith came there out Blood and Water. Finally, at about the setting of the sun, Joseph of Arimathea came with Nicodemus (both of them had been secret disciples of Jesus), and they took down the all-holy Body of the Teacher from the Cross and anointed it with aromatic spices, and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth. When they had buried Him in a new tomb, they rolled a great stone over its entrance.

Such are the dread and saving sufferings of our Lord Jesus Christ commemorated today, and in remembrance of them, we have received the Apostolic commandment that a fast be observed every Friday.

George & Naouma (Gioule) Gioles Scholarship Katina John Malta Scholarship Paleologos Scholarship

Applications and instructions for these three scholarships administered by the Department of Philanthropy of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America are available for awards to be made for the 2018-2019 academic year. The **George & Naouma (Gioule) Gioles Scholarship** and the **Katina John Malta Scholarship** are for undergraduate studies, and the **Paleologos Scholarship** is awarded for graduate work of a non-theological nature. Each of these scholarships was established through generous gifts from dedicated Greek Orthodox Christians who wanted to provide financial assistance towards the education of young people from our Orthodox Christian community.

The Christos and Georgia Trakatellis Fellowship

Applications are also available for a fellowship from **The Christos and Georgia Trakatellis Fellowship Fund** for the 2018-2019 academic year. This Fund was established in 2011 by His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios and his brother, Prof. Antonios Trakatellis, in memory of their parents, Christos and Georgia.

The Fund, overseen by the Chancellor's Office, offers fellowships to graduates of Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology to study Greek language, Hellenic culture and liturgical practice. These studies can take place in the United States or, preferably, in Greece or at the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople. The study could be part of an established academic program (Doctoral or Master Levels) or part of a free program, which should be well structured and clearly defined in view of the above stated purpose of the Fund. Candidates shall be chosen based on merit and need. The amount of the fellowship is \$3,000 per semester for up to two semesters. One or more full or partial fellowships will be awarded annually.

The S. Gregory Taylor Scholarship

The Taylor Scholarship Fund offers financial assistance to students pursuing a post-graduate degree in the areas of theology, religious studies, or pastoral training. The Chancellor's Office of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America oversees the Fund and awards scholarships on an annual basis. Awarding of scholarships will be determined based on program of study, financial need, previous academic work, recommendations, availability of funds and how the applicant intends to serve the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America after receiving this degree. Scholarships are awarded for actual course work being done towards a post-graduate degree (an initial graduate-level degree is required). As per the guidelines of the Fund, preference will be given to graduates of Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology.


