Message from Fr. Michael L. Pastrikos

THE JOY OF CELEBRATION

The summer months have finally arrived and we are able to enjoy once again the warm beautiful days that are ahead of us. When you receive this Newsletter, it will probably come to you during the week of the 4th of July celebration. On this day our Nation commemorates the adoption of the Declaration of Independence July 4, 1776. This is a historical day for our country; and yet our men and women are fighting courageously at this very moment in Iraq and Afghanistan for the freedom of democracy that our nation was founded upon.

Let's take a moment to honor those who have lost their lives and those who are still in the trenches fighting for a better day for themselves, our nation, our children, and our families. We owe then a debt of gratitude for their service.

Now, let's get back to the main theme of this article, "The Joy of Celebration." When I speak of this Joy of Celebration, to me, it is a special journey with a personal relationship with Christ. 

THE DORMITION OF THE THEOTOKOS (AUGUST 15TH)



After the Holy Spirit had come down from heaven upon the apostles, they went to preach the Gospel and establish the Holy Church in every nation

Mary also traveled to other cities. When the holy apostle John became Bishop of Ephesus, Mary went there and lived in his house for some time.

Most of the time, however, Mary lived in Jerusalem, on Mount Zion. She was greatly loved and revered by all the members of the Holy Church. The Virgin Mary was the holiest person on earth, because Christ our God had dwelt in her womb. She had been His early mother and He had given her many gifts of grace.

But everyone must die sooner or later, no matter how holy they are. The time came for Mary to die also. But Christ had already conquered death for us.

Now, we know that everyone will rise from the grave just as Christ did on Holy Pascha. For this reason, we no longer say that a believing Orthodox Christian "dies"; we say that they "repose" or "fall asleep", because we know that death is only a sleep, it is only for a while, and everyone will rise again someday. This is what the work "Dormition" means: to go to sleep for a while.

So, the time came for Mary to repose also, and one day, while she was praying, the Archangel Gabriel appeared to Mary and told her that she would repose in three days.

Mary was overjoyed to hear that she would repose, for she longed to be with Christ in heaven. She called all the Christians in Jerusalem to come to her so she could bid them farewell. To the women that lived in her house as nuns, she gave pieces of her clothing as remembrances. Word was sent to the Apostle James, who was Bishop of Jerusalem, and Mary told him where she was to be buried. All her relatives and the faithful of the Holy Church began to gather. They wept in sorrow, but Mary comforted them telling them that it would be better for them to rejoice than to weep, for Christ's followers do not fear death.

Mary wanted to see the apostles once more before she reposed, so she prayed to God and He answered her. By a great miracle, God transported the apostles to Jerusalem, to the bedside of the holy virgin.

Mary peacefully reposed, with joy and hope, at the ninth hour of the day. She was carried with honor to her family's tomb at the foot of the Mount of Olives. By God's will, only the Apostle Thomas had not been brought to Mary's bedside, but he came to Jerusalem as soon as he heard about her repose. God had caused this because He wanted to give the Holy Church a special revelation. Thomas begged the apostles to open Mary's tomb so that he could see her one last time. When they opened her grave, it was empty. Christ had taken Mary's body to heaven also. Thus, we know that she is alive and already raised from the dead and she constantly prays for all Orthodox people, and helps us in time of trouble.

Because of this revelation, the apostles and the first Christians understood that they were to give special honor to the Virgin Mary and call on her in prayer for help.

PARAKLESIS TO THE VIRGIN MARY

Throughout our Church history, no woman has been more loved, more lauded and more cherished than the Blessed Virgin Mary. She herself foretold it: "For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed." (Luke 1:48) In beautiful poetic-hymnography, which is characteristic of Byzantine Chant in the Eastern Orthodox Church, the Theotokos, the Mother of God is honored and esteemed for her unique role in the salvation of the human race. Through her, the Word of God became flesh and the Infinite became, as it were finite. Humanity took on divine presence and Divinity took on humanity. The Theotokos is the vehicle, par excellence of humility and obedience and thus a supreme example of redeemed mankind.

As the Mother of our Lord, she is our greatest ally and our most fervent intercessor, "for...the prayer of the righteous has great power in its effects." (James 5:16) During the Paraklesis Service, we ask the Most Holy Theotokos to save us just as those drowning reach out to those on dry land. Let us then seek with confidence the help and intercession of the Mother of Light, Mary, the Mother of our Lord.

Let us also honor the Mother of our Lord, as many others before us have, by coming and participating in the Paraklesis Services, so that we can all praise the Mother of our Lord with Hymn and song.

ΕΝΗΜΕΡΩΤΙΚΉ ΕΚΘΕΣΉ ΑΠΌ ΤΗΝ ΕΠΙΤΡΟΠΉ ΤΗΣ ΠΛΑΤΕΙΑΣ

Η Επιτροπή της Πλατείας συνεδρίασε στις 2 Ιουνίου, 2009, για να ανακεφαλαιώσει και εξετάσει την τελική πρόοδο των αρχιτεκτονικών και μηχανικών σχεδίων και την έναρξη του Α' ΠΛΑΝΟΥ της νέας οικοδομής – ήτοι την αποπεράττωση του πρώτου ορόφου του κτιρίου. Η πρόοδος σ' αυτό το σημείο είναι δύσκολη διότι βρέθηκαν πολλά εμπόδια στη δομή του κτιρίου (μεταλικές κολώνες) όπως και στην οικοδομή του περιπτέρου της Ορχήστρας.

Επίσης οι μηχανικοί μας εφεύνησαν την επάφκια Φυσικού Αεφίου, τις οικοδομικές σιδεφοκολώνες, τον ηλεκτφισμό, παφοχή ύδφευσης και αποχέτευσης και πρότειναν διοφθωτικές αλλαγές που πρέπει να γίνουν για να προχωφήσουμε το έφγο και να ανταποκφιθούμε στις απαιτούμενες προϋοποθέσεις της Πολιτείας ούτως ώστε να μας παφαχωφήσουν την άδεια.

Η τελειοποίηση του πρώτου ορόφου θα περιλαμβάνει τον χώρο υποδοχής και τις αίθουσες συνεδριάσεων (χωρητικότητας 150 ατόμων), όπως επίσης γραφείο συναλλαγών, αίθουσα γάμου, μπάρ, αίθουσα ανάπαυσης, την κουζίνα και τις τουαλέτες. Όταν όμως κάναμε απογραφή των συσκευών της κουζίνας, βρήκαμε ότι χρειάζονται επισκευή και άλλες διορθώσεις.

Ανακαλύψαμε επίσης πρόβλημα διείσδυσης νερού στο υπόγειο, το οποίο εξετάσαμε εν μέρει (θα το εξετάσουμε περισσότερο σύντομα). Θέματα που έχουν επίσης σχέση με την παροχή νερού, το καζάνι για την διοχέτευση άχρηστων λυπαρών, και τη σύνδεση με την αποχέτευση ήδη τελείωσαν. Διορθώσεις των σιδεροκολώνων, στο κτίριο και στο περίπτερο της Ορχήστρας έχουν τελειώσει. Όλες οι εργασίες αυτές έπρεπε να γίνουν για να διορθώσουμε τα κακώς έχοντα της οικοδομής, τα λάθος υλικά και τις κτιριακές παραβάσεις σύμφωνα με τις απαιτούμενες προδιαγραφές της Πόλης. Όλες οι κτιριακές διορθώσεις έχουν συμπληρωθεί σύμφωνα με τον κώδικα οικοδομών της Πολιτείας (πρέπει να συμμιορφωνόμαστε σύμφωνα με το νέο οικοδομικό κώδικα) για να μπορέσουμε να υποβάλλουμε τα σχέδια για να μας παραχωρήσουν την άδεια οικοδομής. Τα αρχιτεκτονικά σχέδια και τα σχέδια του μηχανικού σύντομα θα υποβληθούν για έγκριση.

Αφού έγιναν όλες οι απαφαίτητες διορθώσεις στη Πλατεία, εξετάστηκαν από τους ειδικούς επιστήμονες, οι οποίοι ενέκριναν ότι οι κτιριακές εγκαταστάσεις συμμορφούνται με τον κώδικα την Πόλης της Βαλτιμόρης και της Πολιτείας του Μαίφυλαντ. Τώρα πιστεύουμε ότι το κτίριο είναι ασφαλές. Όταν θα τελειοποιηθεί θα είναι ένας μεγάλος πόρος εισοδήματος για την Εκκλησία μας που θα μας επιτρέψει να τελειώσουμε και το υπόλοιπο κτίριο.

Τελειώνοντας η Επιτροπή παραδέχεται ότι η πρόοδος ήταν πολύ δύσκολη μάλλον πολύ δυσκολότερη από ότι το περιμέναμε. Το ενδιαφέρον μας τώρα έχει συγκεντρωθεί στο να σας διαβεβαιώσουμε ότι η Πλατεία συμβάλλει στις ανάγκες της Ελληνικής Κοινότητας.

Αν και οι προσπάθειες της Επιτροπής και του Εργολάβου είχαν σαν αποτέλεσμα να γλυτώσουμε περίπου \$200.000.00 στο μελλοντικό κόστος της οικοδομής, ακόμη χρειαζόμαστε την βοήθεια των μελών μας για να τελειοποιηθεί ο πρώτος όροφος. Τελευταία η Επιτροπή έχει συγκεντρώσει στην Τράπεζα \$200,000.00 και την έγκριση να μας δοθεί δάνειο. Οι δωρεές όλων μας πρέπει να ανέλθουν στο ποσόν των \$300,000.00 για να αρχίσουμε την αποπεράττωση του Α΄ ΠΛΑΝΟΥ. Παρακαλείστε να επικοινωνήσετε με το Κοινοτικό Γραφείο για να κάνετε την δωρεά σας.

PLATEIA COMMITTEE REPORTS PROGRESS

The Plateia Committee met on June 2nd to review progress toward the completion of architectural and engineering plans and the initiation of phase one, new construction – the completion of the first floor of the building. Progress to this point has been difficult in that deficiencies were found in the structural steel members of the Plateia building as well as the orchestra shell (covered stage in the Field). Research for adequacy

was performed by our engineers for gas, structural steel, electric, water and sewer with corrective measures taken to bring the building up to new building code requirements.

The completion of the first floor will include the reception area and meeting rooms (capacity up to 150 people), as well as a Business Office and a Bridal room, Bar, Lounge area, the kitchen and bathrooms. At this point, the kitchen equipment has been inventoried, and maintenance and additional needs identified.

Water infiltration problems in the basement have been analyzed and partially addressed (with more action to come), and issues related to water supply, grease trap and sewer connections have been resolved. Steel work and repairs to both the main building and the outdoor pavilion were completed. All these actions had to be taken to correct substandard construction, incorrect materials and building code violations.

Also, structural steel reinforcements have been completed to the Plateia and covered stage. All these actions to correct building code violations (we have to comply with the now-current codes) were needed to enable the submission of drawings for City building permits. Architectural and Engineering plans will be submitted soon for approval.

After the corrective actions, the Plateia building and stage area were inspected by professionals and found to be in conformance with Baltimore City and Maryland code. We are confident that we will have a safe building when completed, it will be a revenue producing asset for the Church and aid us in completing the entire building.

The Committee concluded that the progress has been difficult and deliberate, admitting that it took far longer than any of us would have liked. We are now focused on assuring that the Plateia and Field contribute to the Greek Community's needs.

While the combined actions of the Committee and North Point Builders have resulted in savings of \$200,000.00 in the bank and a commitment from the bank line of credit. More success in fundraising is needed, as we remain nearly \$300,000.00 short initiate Phase 1 construction.
