

Message from FR. MICHAEL L. PASTRIKOS, PROTOPRESBYTER

DO YOU TRUST IN GOD! THEN WHERE IS YOUR FAITH?

In Luke 8:22 - Jesus asked: "WHERE IS YOUR FAITH?" I believe this is the same question the Lord would ask our society today: WHERE IS YOUR FAITH...? Where or what do you put your trust in? In yourself, your own wisdom, your strength, your career, or your family? It is well known and researched that no human being can live without faith in someone or something.

If we take the Christian and non-Christian person, they both have faith but the difference between the two is the object of their faith. And this is what we are going to focus on in this article "THE OBJECT OF FAITH." In Hebrews: 11:6, it says: And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him. 

Why this change? Since we are on this issue, I would like to ask a question? Has anyone ever made a U-Turn in their lives? Has anyone made a change from negative to positive? We have many examples of people in the Bible who made U-Turns in their lives. Another question - Were you ever in a wrong place at the wrong time, and from that experience has your life become a mess? Have you ever been on the road traveling and you came to a point where you were lost? Did you ask for help? Making wrong choices and taking wrong directions is a part of life, but we also have to understand that we need to correct our wrong decisions and make them right. There is nothing progressive about being stubborn and pigheaded and refusing to admit that you made a mistake.

When the Prodigal Son repented for his mistake, he didn't just sit there and feel sorry for himself. He immediately changed the direction of his life. He said: "I will rise and go to my father."

When Moses threw the staff into the Red Sea, and the waters were separated, didn't God change the course of life for the Jews? "Of Course He Did." Let us open the Old Testament, in the book of Numbers chapter 21; we read that the Judaic people were under the guidance and leadership of Moses. When they left from Egypt to seek and find the "Land of Honey", they were traveling in the wilderness for 40 years. They had nothing, but God did not abandon them. He fed them prime meat; he gave them Manna instead of bread. From that experience, they should have been proud of God and worshiped Him faithfully, but did they do that? No. Instead they started to curse Him, and went against God. This is the "thank you" that they gave Him. When Christ was on the Cross, did that change anyone? No, they all ran away for fear of the Jews. Is history repeating itself? Has our society changed for the better, "I don't think so!"

Everyone, whether Christian or not, will face some form of challenges during his or her lifetime. But how do we deal with the storm is the crucial importance. But very often our response to the problems of life is not that of faith, but "Fear". Fear is the natural reaction we have when we feel we are losing control, when things

are not moving according to plan. We need to face our challenges head on and never be afraid to express our difficulties.

We all share different views and experiences, but we need to exercise what we base our thoughts and discussions on when we communicate with other people. We have people today with so much pain and tragedy. The world is turning upside down. All the wars, the hunger, the mass killings, people leaving their homelands with no end in sight. Tragedies are happening all over the world. But how can we correct all the problems of the world? We have the power within ourselves to turn the struggles and pains around by seeking God's blessings and instruction. We need to be focusing more on our spiritual soul than on anything else. What does someone gain when he or she wins the world, but loses his or soul doing it? Nothing. We truly don't gain anything because when we leave this world we take nothing with us. This is a big dilemma that our Society is facing (this spiritual issue) and will be facing in the generations to come.

I would like to conclude with the following short story.

One day a man dreamed that he went to church with an angel as his guide. The church was filled, but oddly, there was no sound. The organist played, but no music could be heard; the choir's lips moved, but no song came forth. The priest went through the motions of preaching, but the man heard nothing. He asked the angel "Why?" The angel replied: "This is the service as God sees it. When there is no heart in it, there is no sound." Then in the back pew he heard a child pray. The angel said "You are hearing the only part God hears, that which comes from the heart."

If you want to connect with God, it's more than just coming and going through a few motions, moving your lips to sing a few songs, sitting in a seat and hearing a few words by the priest. You've got to connect with God in SPIRIT, if you want to get the strength that you need to carry you through the obstacles of life.

THE HOLY APOSTLE AND EVANGELIST LUKE

(OCTOBER 18)

Saint Luke came from the city of Antioch, probably of a pagan family. From his youth he applied himself to seek after wisdom and to study the arts and sciences. He traveled all over the world to quench his thirst for knowledge, and had particular skill as a physician and in painting. The Gospel he wrote shows his excellent command of Greek; he also knew Hebrew and Aramaic.

There is a tradition that Luke was one of the Seventy Disciples that the Lord Jesus Christ sent before Him, two by two, to announce salvation in the towns and villages. Luke was in Jerusalem at the time of the life-giving Passion and, on Easter morning, walked with Cleopas (October 30) towards the village of Emmaus, distraught at the loss of the Master. But sadness was turned into unspeakable joy when Christ, whom they were unable to recognize when He joined them on the way, revealed to them in the breaking of bread that He was really and truly risen (Luke 24:35). After the descent of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost, Luke remained for a time in Jerusalem where there were already disciples. Some say that on his way back to Antioch he stopped to preach the Good News at Sebaste in Samaria, where he obtained the relic of the right hand of the Holy Forerunner, which he took as a precious trophy to his own city. It was, therefore, at Antioch where he met Saint Paul in the course of his second missionary journey and accompanied him thence to proclaim salvation in Greece.

But another tradition says that Luke did not know the Lord during His earthly sojourn, and that he met Saint Paul while working as a physician at Thebes in Boeotia during the reign of Claudius (c. 42 AD). The Apostle's fiery words convinced him of the Truth that he had vainly sought in the wisdom of this world for so many years. Without hesitation, he gave up all that he had and his profession in physical medicine to follow Paul and become the beloved physician (Colossians 4:14) of souls.

He went with the Apostle in his journeys from Troas to Philippi, where Paul left him to nurture the newly born Church. Luke remained in Macedonia for some years and, when Paul visited Philippi again during his third journey (AD 58), he sent him to Corinth to receive the collection made by the faithful there for the needs of the poor at Jerusalem. They went together to the Holy City, strengthening the Churches on their way. When Paul was arrested in Jerusalem and transferred to Caesarea, Luke remained with him. He accompanied Paul to Rome and describes their difficult and eventful voyage at the end of the Acts of the Apostles (chapters 27-28). Luke wrote his Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles at Rome in obedience to Paul, dedicating the Acts to Theophilus, the Governor of Achaia, who was a convert. In his Gospel, Luke adds details which are not found in the first two evangelists: in telling of the Savior's life, he especially stresses His mercy and compassion for sinful

humanity that He has come to visit as a Physician (Luke 4:23; 5:31).

And in the Acts, after telling of all that happened in the foundation of the Church at Jerusalem, he gives most attention to the work of his master, Saint Paul, who labored more abundantly than all the other Apostles in spreading the glad tidings of salvation.

After two years of imprisonment in Rome, Paul was released and immediately resumed his traveling ministry, followed by his faithful disciple Luke. But Nero launched his furious persecution of the Christians in Rome soon after, and Paul returned to the city at the risk of his life to strengthen the faithful there. He was arrested, put in chains, and held in far worse conditions than before. Luke remained steadfastly faithful to his master while others forsook him (Timothy 4:11), and he was probably present at Saint Paul's martyrdom, although he left no written testimony to the fact.


After the glorious death of the Apostle of the Gentiles, Luke made his way back to Achaia, preaching the Gospel in Italy, Dalmatia and Macedonia. It is said that, in his old age, amid great tribulations, he also evangelized the idolaters in Egypt. He is supposed to have gone as far as the remote Thebaid and to have consecrated Saint Abile, the second Bishop of Alexandria.

On his return to Greece, Luke became Bishop of Thebes in Boeotia; he ordained priests and deacons, established churches and healed the sick in

soul and body by his prayer. The idolaters arrested him there when he was eighty-four years old. They flayed him alive and crucified him on an olive tree. Many miracles were wrought afterwards by a miraculous myron trickling from his tomb, which was particularly effective in the cure of eye diseases for those who, in faith, anointed themselves with it.

Many years later, the Emperor Constantius, the son of Saint Constantine the Great, sent Saint Artemius (October 20) to Thebes to bring the relics of the Apostle Luke to Constantinople, where they were placed under the altar of the Church of the Holy Apostles with the relics of the Apostles Andrew and Timothy.

It is the tradition of the Church that Saint Luke was the first iconographer and that he painted an image of the Holy Mother of God in her earthly lifetime. The All Holy Virgin praised this representation and said, "May the grace of Him who was born of me be upon this image." Saint Luke afterwards painted other images of the All Holy Virgin and of the Apostles, giving rise in the Church to the devout and holy tradition of veneration of the icons of Christ and of His Saints. For this reason, Saint Luke is honored as the patron of iconographers.



STEWARDSHIP NEWS

The time is fast approaching when 2016 will come to a close and we will begin a New Year, a new year with high hopes, aspirations, dreams and goals, not only for ourselves but for our family as well. We do this as one of our very top priorities as it should be. But another top priority should be about our Church's welfare and concern not only for the coming New Year but for this current year that we are still in. As I mentioned above, the 2016 year is quickly coming to a close and a lot of our St. Nicholas faithful have not yet made any effort to fulfill their Stewardship obligation. Here at St. Nicholas, we try and do our best to see to it that the needs of all parishioners are at least cared for. And as we try to meet the needs and to minister to the needs of all our parishioners, members or not, we ask that those who are not, at least try and make a conscientious effort to become. We have come a long way here at St. Nicholas, and in order for our parish to be more dynamic, and more viable, it needs the support of ALL its parishioners. Unfortunately, not everyone is supporting our Church ministry. As you see by the names that are printed in the Koinonia, only half of our families have thus far supported the St. Nicholas ministry and yet every parishioner, member or not, enjoys and demands the benefits derived from St. Nicholas. Where are the other families? Where are our Young Adults (married or single) who are over the age of 21 and working? Doesn't the Church belong to them too? According to our Parish membership, we have over 900 families registered. As of September 30, 2016 we have 500 families that have signed their Stewardship Pledge, bringing in the sum of \$175,310.20 paid to date, \$149,710.70 leaving the unpaid balance of \$25,599.50. Some of you might be looking at this as the glass half empty or half full. Whichever way one wants to interpret this to me there is more work to be done. Becoming a Steward of the church solidifies your commitment to help our church not only grow, but to thrive. With these numbers shown above we are not thriving, our families are not supporting their church as they should. We have hundreds of families in the parish that are well off financially. There should be no excuse to any one for their lack of support towards the parish. Our community should be thriving financially according to the amount of families that we have in the parish. We have received an update on one of the parishes in our Archdiocese. They have 553 families in their parish and their stewardship with pledges received, came to a total of \$700,000. We have over 900 families in our parish and we received so far this year a total of \$175,310.20. This is a negative showing on our part as parishioners and supporters of our parish. We cannot continue to embrace the idea that we need Festivals, Dances, Concerts, and other events to support our parish financially. Something has to be done about this, or else we are heading towards a negative path and not a positive one. Many of you who are not Stewards and have not sent in their annual pledge to the church, we ask you please consider all the above reasons for becoming a good standing member of the Church. We hope and pray that by the end of the year that our remaining 400 families that have not pledged will make that promise a reality. Let's work together to make our Stewardship pledge for 2016 the best ever.






GREEK SCHOOL NEWS






